Welcome! The 81st Annual Hampton Cup Regatta, the largest Inboard Hydroplane Race in the country speeds back into Hampton, Virginia August 10-12, 2007 for the Summer Nationals. Be present as the oldest continuous inboard race in North America celebrates its 81st anniversary, returning to Hampton Roads for another year of maritime excitement.

Stand amazed as more than 100 hydroplanes and runabouts from the United States and Canada take to the waters of Mill Creek competing at speeds in excess of 150 miles-per-hour. Experience the fastest and loudest piston-powered racing boats in the world when the competition returns for another year.

Bridge opens at 10:00 to the public. Races start at 12:00 Noon and end at approximately 5:00 p.m. daily in Mill Creek, located at the entrance of Fort Monroe from the East Mercury Boulevard bridge in Hampton, Virginia. The regatta is the largest sporting event in Hampton, drawing spectators from as far away as New Jersey and racers from as far away as New Zealand.

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Non- FOOD VENDOR ELECTRICAL SERVICE REQUIREMENTS

IMPORTANT!! Please note that electric generators cannot be run during the event. They may be used at night when the public is not on the bridge.

Each vendor must bring their own extension cords. A 3-wire grounded cord is recommended. Cords should be a minimum length of 100 ft. All extension cords should be appropriate for the equipment being used.

VENDOR CHECKLIST AND CONTACT INFO

Fees: \$600 for 20' x 20' space.

\$100 for 110v hookup up to 4 plugs. Each additional plug is \$25.

\$150 for 220v hookup.

Items to accomplish before event:

The HCR will obtain a promoter's permit for the event so you do not need to get a business license for City of Hampton.

Interesting Facts: It never fails that either Friday or Saturday night we have a thunderstorm. Everything on the bridge gets blown around. So, at night we ask that everything be secured and tied down. You may bring rope and lash the back side of your tents or anything else to the bridge railing. This is also the reason we ask for contact number while you are in town. This way, if something happens I can contact you.

VENDOR AGREEMENT AND INDEMNITY FORM

This agreement dated _____ by and between the Hampton Cup Regatta Committee for the 81st Hampton Cup Regatta, Hampton, Va. and

_____ (non-food vendor) states as follows:

I. The vendor agrees:

1. To be completely set-up by Thursday August 9th by midnight.
2. To provide services on the days of the 10th, 11th, and 12th. No vendor is permitted to breakdown before 6pm on Sunday the

12th. If for some reason the racing goes past 6pm no breakdown will take place until the public is off the bridge.

3. To obtain all permits and licenses required by the City of Hampton.
4. To provide a copy of a certificate of insurance indicating that vendor is insured with a minimum of \$1,000,000 public liability and naming Hampton Cup Regatta, Phoebus Civic Association, and City of Hampton as additional insured.
5. To pay all application fees by June 1, 2007. Vendor understands that *all fees are non-refundable*.
6. To abide by all Hampton City ordinances and Hampton Cup Regatta Vendor Rules.
7. To abstain from the intake of alcoholic beverages while working in their concession. Also, to not bring any alcoholic beverages onto the bridge with them.
8. To lock down concession area at night. The Hampton Cup Regatta Committee, Phoebus Civic Association, nor the City of Hampton is not responsible for anything left out, awnings left up, or other items left unsecured which are taken or blown away in the night.
9. Break down boxes and flatten and put bags of trash in front of concession and they will be picked up and taken to the dumpster. *Under no circumstances can anything be thrown over the guardrail into the creek.*

II. Hampton Cup Regatta agrees to provide to the vendor:

1. A 20' x 20' space on the bridge. **This does not include tent, electricity, tables, chairs, or water.** Keep in mind, new city ordinance requires a minimum of 20ft between food cooking areas.
2. Electrical power service is spaced out on the bridge.
3. HCR Committee will do its best to assist with getting personnel and supplies to the concession once traffic on the bridge is stopped.

III. During the term of this agreement the vendor assumes all risks incident to or in connection with the permitted activity and shall be solely responsible for damage or injury, of whatever kind or nature, to person or property, directly or indirectly arising out of or in connection with the operation of the vendor's concession. Vendor also certifies that the information on this application is true to the best of his knowledge and to comply with the rules and regulations herein set forth. The vendor further understands that failure to comply with these rules and regulations will result in

their concession being shut down. Unsigned applications will be returned.
